
HELEN DAVIES




ROBERT JONES

To celebrate Rossendale Art Trail, The Whitaker is opening its Garden Gallery. Located at the rear of the museum, with beautiful views over the Valley, this space contains permanent works by **James Bloomfield** and **Noah Rose**. Originally part of the National Festival of Making at Blackburn Cathedral, Bloomfield's work now brings colour and vibrancy to the Whitaker's Garden Gallery, whilst Rose's typographic sculpture considers the life and legacy of Irish social reformer Michael Davitt. The Gallery also includes temporary installations by artist **Paddy Campbel1**.

The Garden Gallery is a changing space, with upcoming installations by a group of local young people as part of our Whitaker Park: Sounds of the Past project. Look out for future plans as we continue to bring this previously unloved space back to life.

Whilst at The Whitaker, also don't miss 'Contagious Acts' by artist **Jamie Holman**. This exhibition ends on 1st June so it's your last chance to catch this site wide installation.
